During the holiday season, GCAP helped bring smiles to kids and families by donating toys to several local organizations, including the BLM Office toy drive, Advocate Safehouse Project, and CASA of the Ninth. These donations stayed right here in the community, helping ensure the season felt a little brighter for those who needed it most.

Gondola Giving That Went a Long Way

One of the year's most impactful efforts came through the annual **Gondola Giving** campaign. Between November 14 and 26, guests who brought a \$25 City Market gift card to the ticket office received four free gondola tickets. Every gift card collected went directly to LIFT-UP, supporting local families facing food insecurity.

Thanks to guest participation, the campaign raised **\$7,345 in City Market gift cards**.
